The Muslim and Arab American leaders of Oregon and SW Washington are thankful for the vigilance of alert and loyal residents of New York city including Senegalese Muslim Aliou Niasse, who first noticed and pointed out the suspicious smoke coming from the vehicle, Lance Orton, who called the police, and Officers Wayne Rhatigan and Pam Duffy for acting swiftly and courageously to contain the damage and prevent the loss of life and limb of fellow Americans.

The Muslim and Arab American leaders of Oregon and SW Washington ask our fellow Muslim and Arab Americans to stay true to their faiths and cultural values in rejecting any ideas or actions that tolerate or attempt to justify the use of terrorism for any purpose or by any group.
